Holidays in Term Time - May we please remind parents that taking holidays in term time does have an impact on your child's learning. Can we please ask you to read our Attendance Policy on our website so you are fully aware of the implications of taking your child on holiday in term time.

Strike Action: We will keep you updated as to whether teaching unions have confirmed strike dates and whether this will impact our school.

Strep A: Please can we look out for the signs of Strep A. If your child is confirmed of having Strep A, they have to have 24 hours of anti-biotics before returning to school.

Common symptoms of strep A include:

- <u>flu-like symptoms</u>, such as a high temperature, swollen glands or an aching body
- <u>sore throat</u> (strep throat or <u>tonsillitis</u>)
- a rash that feels rough, like sandpaper (scarlet fever)
- scabs and sores (<u>impetigo</u>)
- pain and swelling (cellulitis)
- severe muscle aches
- nausea and vomiting

Strep A infections are more common in children, but adults can also sometimes get them.

Most strep A infections are not serious and can be treated with antibiotics.

But rarely, the infection can cause serious problems. This is called invasive group A strep (iGAS).
