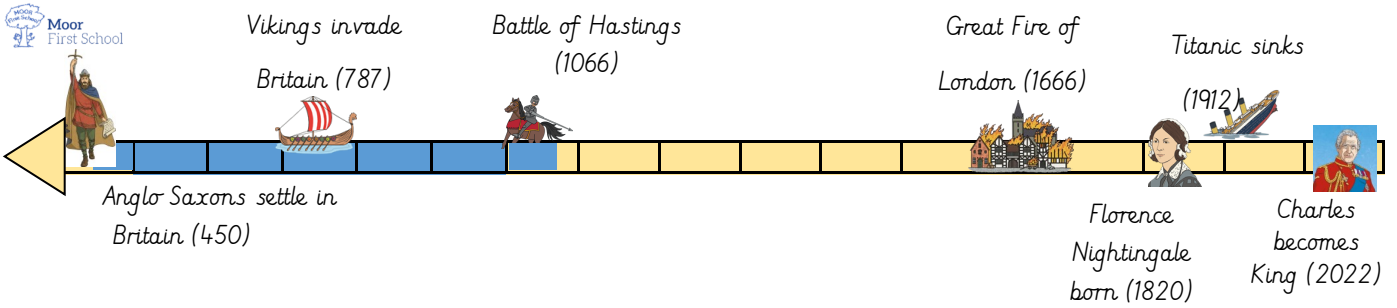


History: Anglo Saxons and Vikings

Vocabulary

monastery	A building or buildings occupied by a community of monks living under religious vows.
settlement	A place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community
conquer	To get something by force.
kingdom	A country whose ruler is a king or a queen.
Longboat	A long, narrow warship, powered by both oar and sail with many rowers.
Lindisfarne	An island of the northeast coast of England which is also known as Holy Island.
raid	A sudden armed attack with the aim of causing damage rather than occupying any of the enemy's land.
trade	The action of buying and selling goods.
invade	To enter as an enemy, by force in order to conquer or plunder.
