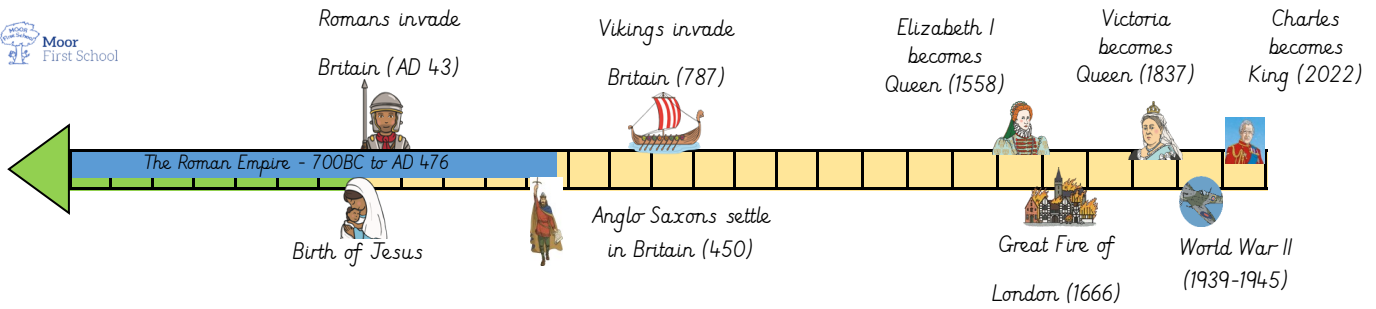


History: The Romans

Vocabulary

Emperor	A monarch or a sovereign ruler of an empire or another type of imperial realm.
Empire	Where a state, or country, is ruled by another state. It is ruled by an emperor.
Invasion	The movement of an army into a region with the aim of conquering it.
Legion	A military group of around 5,000 Roman soldiers.
Legionary	A legionary was a soldier within a Roman legion. They were Roman citizens who signed up for 25 years service.
military	Soldiers, armour and weapons that are used for conflict and war.
Roman	A citizen or resident of ancient Rome.
Rome	The ancient Italian kingdom, republic, and empire whose capital was the city of Rome.
ruler	One person that rules or governs a city, state or country.
