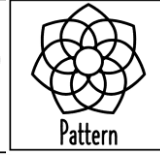
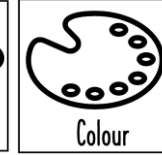
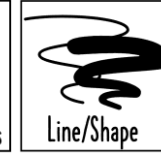
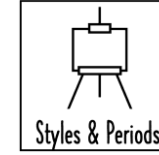
Artist Study:

Andy Warhol is a very famous artist. He was born Andrew Warhola in 1928 in Pennsylvania. His parents were from a part of Europe that is now part of Slovakia. They moved to New York in the 1920s. He started drawing whilst recovering in bed from a long illness. His first job was illustrating adverts in fashion magazines.

He is most famous for his work on printing – especially a technique called screen printing. He liked to use bright colours and repeated images to create his work. Now he is known as one of the most influential artists who have ever lived!

Key Vocabulary

Pop Art	A style of art based on simple bold images of everyday items, painted in bright colours
Primary Colours	A group of colours from which all other colours can be obtained by mixing
Secondary Colours	Colours resulting from the mixing of two primary colours
Design	An outline, sketch or plan
Sketch	A rough or unfinished drawing, often made to assist in making a more finished picture
Media	The material used to create artwork
Texture	The feel or appearance of a surface
Pattern	A repeated decorative design
Technique	The way tools and media are used to create artwork
Collage	A piece of art made by sticking different materials such as photographs, pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing
Print	The transfer of design to paper
Experiment	Try out new ideas or methods
Composition	How lines, shapes and colours are positioned on a page
