## Subject Specific Concepts



## Overview

- I can give examples of how someone might use technology to communicate with others they don't also know offline and explain why this might be risky. (e.g. email, online gaming, a pen-pal in another school / country).
- -I can explain who I should ask before sharing things about myself or others online.
- -I can describe different ways to ask for, give, or deny my permission online and can identify who can help me if I am not sure.
- -I can explain why I have a right to say 'no' or 'I will have to ask someone'. I can explain who can help me if I feel under pressure to agree to something I am unsure about or don't want to do.

## Key Questions

- -Why might someone want to communicate online with someone they already know offline?
- -Is it sometimes ok to communicate with people you don't know online?
- -What are the things you need to think about to stay safe when communicating with people you don't know well?
- -Do you have consent to share these things about yourself?
- -Do you have consent to share these things about others?
- -Can you give examples of when you might have to ask permission before you do something online or when using technology?
- -What might happen if you do not ask permission before sharing things about others online using technology?
- -Should people ask for your permission too before they share things about you?
