Traditional Folk tunes come from around the World. Often the music is passed down through families and friends. Music helps celebrate our differences but often with the same theme of being kind to one another.

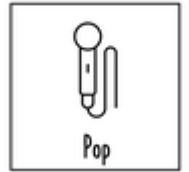
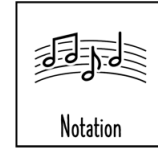
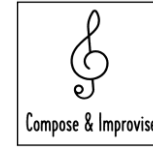
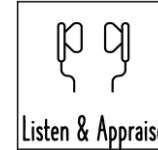

VOCABULARY

Pentatonic scale-	a fixed five-note pattern e.g: the five black keys on a piano
Improvise-	to make up a tune and play it on the spot.
Melody-	another name for tune.
Rhythm-	long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse
Tempo-	the speed of the music; fast or slow or in-between.
Dynamics-	how loud or quiet the music is.

Other words you need to know: Keyboard, drums, bass, pulse, pitch, texture structure, compose, improvise, hook.
