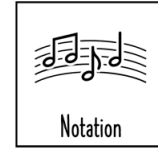
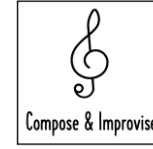

## VOCABULARY

Notation-	the link between sound and symbol.
Improvise-	to make up a tune and play it on the spot.
Rhythm-	long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse
Hook-	A term used in pop music to describe a short catchy phrase or riff that we can't stop singing; the bit that 'hooks' us in; the main musical idea from a song that we remember.
Riff-	short repeated phrase, often played on a lead instrument such as guitar, piano or saxophone.

**Other words you need to know:** Unison, by ear, melody, pitch, pulse, composition, backing vocal, piano, bass, drums, organ, pulse, tempo, dynamics, texture structure, compose, melody, solo.
