## WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

- I know that Muslim public worship takes place in a mosque.
- I know that Muslims prepare for prayer by completing wudu.
- I know that the second Pillar of Islam is called Salat- prayers performed five times a day





Worship	The feeling or expression of reverence and adoration for a deity.
Raktahs	A unit of bodily actions and recitations from the Qur'an said during prayer.
Customs	An activity or pattern of behaviour that reflects a family's values, interests, or beliefs.

## STICKY KNOWLEDGE

Qibla is the direction **towards** the Kaaba in the Sacred Mosque in **Mecca**.

Even at home, Muslims must perform wudu before prayers, take off their shoes and use a prayer mat. They perform several rak'ahs of Salah facing Makkah. Women are not obliged to attend the mosque, so many pray at home with their children. All that is needed is a clean place to pray so that they can show proper respect for Allah.

The Qur'an teaches that the whole world is a mosque, so Muslims can pray anywhere.
