


WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

STICKY KNOWLEDGE

- A map can be used to help you know where to go.
- Symbols are useful for lots of reasons like, space saving on a map, multi-lingual (all languages can understand them), saves time and are clear.
- A compass is marked North, East, South and West.
- Human and physical features are things that you can see all around you. Physical features like seas, mountains and rivers are natural. They would be here even if there were no people around.
 - Human features are things like houses, roads and bridges. They have been built by people.
