Our governing body is responsible to plan the school's future strategic direction and make decisions on the school's budget and staffing. It meets at least once a term, with smaller groups of governors meeting more regularly to discuss particular aspects of the school.

The role of being a school governor is working together with staff to:

- work strategically to help raise standards
- monitor and evaluate progress toward the school priorities and targets
- support and challenge the head and staff
- accounting to all stakeholders for the school's overall performance and for the decisions they have made

As a new governor, you will:

- be supported by an experienced fellow governor
- receive induction training at no cost to yourself
- have your contribution valued
- serve for a period of 4 years, commencing in Autumn/Spring 2024.

What do you need to do?

A nomination form is included with this letter. To be valid, a nomination form must be signed by three other nominees and must be returned to school no later than Wednesday 25th June. With the completed nomination form, a candidate must submit a brief statement about themselves of not more than two hundred words.

Details of nominations received and voting papers will then be sent out to parents a few weeks after if a vote is required. It will include your brief statement about yourself so please try to be thorough. The result will be announced as soon as possible afterwards.
