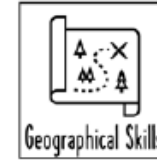

WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

- How to use maps to locate European countries and capitals.
- The names and locations of at least eight European countries.
- Know the names of six cities in England.
- Explain what the equator is (KS1)



VOCABULARY

Tropic of Cancer	One of the five major circles of latitude.
Tropic of Capricorn	One of the five major circles of latitude.
Greenwich Mean Time	The main time form in several countries, including the UK.

Also- climate, equator, world, continent, meridian.



- A capital city is a city or town that has been chosen as the leading city of a country.
- It is often where the government of a country is based.
- Lots of countries leaders and officials do their work in the capital city.
- Often, capital cities are the largest city in their country (e.g. London.) However, this is not always the case (e.g. Ontario in Canada.)

- Use maps and globes to locate the equator, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn and the Greenwich Meridian
